

CMBHA July 2019 Newsletter

The 2019 CMBHA Midseason Scrub Package applies to both power and sail boats and will operate during August as follows.

- £99 for vessels up to 9 metres LOA
- £149 for vessels 9 to 12 metres LOA
- £199 for vessels 12+ metres LOA
- These prices now include tows to and from the lifting dock –saving you an additional £35.00
- Quay Marina staff can take 'before-scrub' and 'after-scrub' photos to be emailed to you if requested and you are not present on the day of the scrub
- Heavily fouled vessels will incur additional charges of £3.95 per metre as per published tariff
- No surveys, anti-fouling, anode changes or propeller cleaning
- No waiting time in slings
- CMBHA to book lifts on members' behalf
- Offer available Monday to Friday inclusive during the month of August (excluding bank holidays)
- Payment to be made to Conwy marina in full in advance of lift
- Conwy Quays Marina resident berth holders only
- Berth holder to be compliant with all other Quay Marinas conditions and Payment Terms

The form will be emailed to a CMBHA committee member, who will check your membership status and then forward it to Quay Marinas, endorsed as valid.

Quay Marinas will then issue you with an invoice, which must be paid before the Scrub. Any further communication/negotiation is then between the member and Quay Marinas.
